MMHP was established in response to the healthcare needs of Maine's growing population of seasonal farmworkers. Its mission has been to improve the health status of these workers and their families. They adopted a mobile healthcare model, bringing medical providers directly to farms, orchards, blueberry barrens, aquaculture sites, and seafood processing facilities across the state. This approach eliminates transportation barriers and minimizes lost work time for patients.



GROWTH & IMPACT

Over the years, MMHP has grown into Maine's only statewide organization dedicated exclusively to delivering healthcare directly to agricultural workers, aquacultural workers, seafood processors, and their families. MMHP has a large network of physicians, nurses, behavioral health specialists, community health workers, interpreters, and health educators serving workers throughout Maine's rural communities.



WHY MMHP MATTERS

MMHP's history is closely tied to Maine's agricultural heritage. As farmworkers remain essential to the state's food system, MMHP has spent four decades ensuring that those who harvest, process, and produce food have access to healthcare regardless of income, language, or transportation.
